Community Outreach Training

The Western Colorado Chapter of Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA) was awarded a grant from the Colorado Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing in the amount of \$7,562. A portion of the grant funded the purchase of three pieces of Hearing Assistive Technology (HAT) to be used for demonstration and outreach.

<u>We need volunteers</u> to help us share information about Hearing Assistive Technology. The training will show how to set up and use the equipment purchased:

UBI duo - a device to assist communication with someone who is deaf or non-oral Tabletop loop system - a portable loop device with a small range Personal listening system - an assistive device for personal use

We will also provide information about the mission of the Chapter and the national organization, with the goal of reaching out to individuals, businesses, service providers, and government agencies in western Colorado to create awareness of technology, services, and information available to people who are deaf and hard of hearing.

Please note, the chapter is not selling any equipment; we simply want to make businesses and agencies aware of potential devices to help consumers and clients, as well as provide education about HLAA and our Chapter.

News from the National Office

Hearing aids are expensive. It is the number one query/complaint that we hear at the local and national level. The national office supports a new Food & Drug Administration regulatory classification for over-the-counter (OTC) hearing aids. OTC aids would be targeted to adults who are in the earlier stages of hearing loss.

By opening the market to OTC aids, new manufacturers could enter the hearing aid space and sell directly to consumers. Studies show that high-quality OTC hearing devices can perform just as well as costly hearing aids, for people with mild-to-moderate hearing loss. These devices are designed to retail between \$150 and \$299.
